What Is Video Editing?

It's combining different videos, audio, images, text and graphics together to form a new video.

But, it's a little more than that...



What do editors do?

Editors combine together the raw footage of a film or video project.

An average, edited 2-hour film may have hundreds of hours of raw footage. Short-form projects will have less, but still far more than what goes into the final cut.

This is assembled into sequences, refined, music, soundFX, graphics and VFX are added and you have something you can call, a film


